To explain the project...

A traditional building with heavy building mass has one main purpose, and one form to satisfy the requirements, and it raises the many times repeated question : „How to modify, how to change it to satisfy new requirements, to serve other purposes?“

These buildigs originally have the characteristic feature to take place like just one point on these scales mentionedb above. Our aim was to create a „building“ that is able to cover more place on these scales: it's flexible.

Furniture can be much more flexible than building mass. This furniture-like structure has the ability to expand and even contract if you want, can be fully open or closed as well.

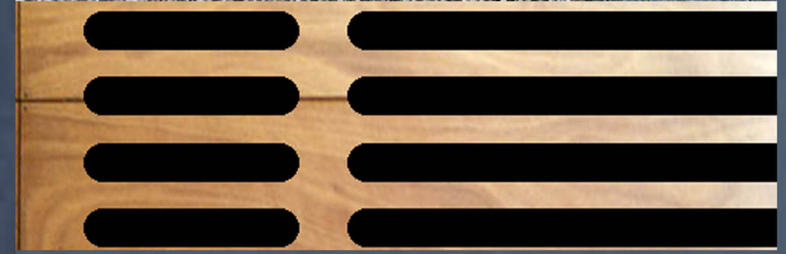
To meet the requirement of 10days construction time, we reduced the main structure to the roof that protects from rain and resists snow. Under this roof can be happen many things.

Also wanted to retain the visual contact in the direction between the hotel and the valley, and make the roof with the less support as possible to gain a space, that space could serve for programmes with greater demand on space, not only for the hotel for any garden party or other programmes, but even for arrange a small exposition or artisan class for the children from the village.

The moving walls determine rooms, closer spaces,can protect from wind but still preserve transparency and for the winter you just close it and it stores paravanes, instruments etc.,.

To finish at that short time, we thought to construct it of wooden panelling and wooden structure.

The materials we used: wooden panelling ,wooden structure, cast-floor or asphalt, aluminium profiles, metal rail to guide the moving walls, zinc roof.
