









Regent's Canal

The eight-mile Regent's Canal takes its name from the man who commissioned it in 1812: The Prince Regent, who became King George IV. Designed to link the Grand Union Canal with the River Thames at Limehouse, its first stretch - from Paddington to Camden - opened in 1816. At Regent's Canal Dock, renamed Limehouse Basin, cargo which had come by sea - such as ice, timber, coal, building materials, food and gunpowder - was unloaded onto canal boats to continue its journey into England.

Key canal sites

A half-hour walk from Camden along the towpath, or five minutes from both Paddington Station and Warwick Avenue Underground Station, Little Venice is the junction between the Regent's Canal and the Grand Union Canal (Paddington Branch). This picturesque area boasts a waterside café, boat trips, two theatres and various waterside pubs Little Venice, London W2 6ND

Blow Up Bridge
Officially called Macclesfield Bridge, this gained otoriety and its nickname in 1874 after barge carrying gunpowder blew up beneath it. Although the bridge was destroyed, its supporting columns were saved, and repositioned the 'wrong' way round, so that the rope grooves worn by the horses' towropes can be seen on both the canal and towpath sides Macclesfield Bridge, London NW8

Regent's Park
One of the largest and most spectacular open spaces in London, the park is just 10 min walk from Camden along the Regent's Canal towpath or 20 minutes from Little Venice. The unique space was designed and built as part of the same historic project as the Regent's Canal in 1811. Today, while retaining its impressive regency character, it is also home to sport, theatre, music and dance, award-winning gardens, a range of cafés, elegant fountains, three playgrounds, a variety of lakes, the famous London Zoo, an open air theatre and some of the best bird watching in London. The Regent's Canal provides a scenic route along the north edge of the park and also borders the open grass of Primrose Hill which has spectacular views over London. www.royalparks.org.uk

Access for all

Towpaths around Little Venice and Paddington Basin have been improved and visitors in wheelchairs can now access the canalside at Little Venice, travel to Paddington Basin and back. Little Venice to Camden is inaccessible by wheelchair due to steep ramps and steps.

Access to the Regent's Canal towpath to see the Nash designed houses and London Zoo Aviary is best from Gloucester Avenue. From here, with the help of an able-bodied companion, wheelchair users can also reach Camden Lock, though there are cobbles and slopes.

Angling around central London

Angling is one of the many leisure activities that reel people in to the Regent's Canal. Get a permit from British Waterways London (just £20 for adults, £10 for concessions) and see if you could fall hook line and sinker for this popular waterside pursuit. Wildlife around the waterway

The Regent's Canal runs alongside Regent's Park and London Zoo and offers plenty of opportunities for wildlife spotting. The most commonly seen creatures are swans, geese, mallards, coots, moorhens, cormorants and tufted ducks.

At dusk and dawn you may see Daubenton and Pipistrelle bats, particularly near London Zoo which provides bat boxes in trees alongside the canal.

You may also catch glimpses of the zoo's inhabitants, such as African red river hogs, warthogs, African hunting dogs and exotic birds in the Snowdon Aviary.





Educational Entertainment

WOW stands for 'Wild Over Waterways'. The wow4water website is an educational resource full of fun activities for children that help them to learn more about the history and wildlife of canals and rivers and water safety.
